**Davydov and Others v. Russia**

Dear Madam,

I acknowledge receipt on 9 December 2011 of your letter of 8 December 2011 requesting the European Court of Human Rights to make an interim measure under Rule 39 of the Rules of Court to prevent a postponement of the announcement of final election results.

**Your file has been given the above number. You must refer to it in any further correspondence relating to this case.**

On 14 December 2011, after examining the request, the Acting President of the Section to which the case has been allocated decided not to indicate to the Government of Russia, under Rule 39 of the Rules of Court, the interim measure you are seeking.

In these circumstances, your request under Rule 40 will not be dealt with either.

The Court will deal with the case as soon as practicable on the basis of the information and documents submitted by you. **Please note that if you wish to send any documents in addition to your application, you should not send original documents as they will not be returned to you by the Court.** The proceedings are primarily in writing and you will only be required to appear in person if the Court invites you to do so. You will be informed of any decision taken by the Court.

For safety reasons, any object sent to the Court without having being expressly requested by the Registry will be destroyed immediately together with the cover letter. If you

consider sending documents other than on paper, you should first get in touch with the Registry.
